Canberra Excursion

Choir and Band Students from our school will soon be undertaking an education tour of the national capital. Students will be given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$60 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion. This amount was deducted from the students' ticket price before they were charged.

Young Carers Project

Are you a student with a significant caring role?

This project supports students 18 years and under who have a significant caring role to complete their secondary education.

What is a Young Carer?

A Young Carer is someone who provides significant support for a parent, partner, child, relative or friend who has chronic illness, disability, mental illness, alcohol or other substance dependence or who is frail aged.

What can we do?

Support is based upon the individual needs of the young person but may include some of the following examples:

- •Respite ~ a short break from your caring responsibilities to spend time on school work or other school activities.
- Tuition support.
- Material resources such as school books or uniforms.
- Support to attend school activities
- •Referral to appropriate services.

What will happen if you call our service?

Young Carers or their advocates will complete a Young Carer eligibility assessment that will inform us of the scope of your caring role and help us understand the challenges that may be present.

We will then discuss what supports would best assist your situation and who may be available to help. We can then provide assistance to bring these supports into place and help you stay at school. You can contact us whenever you need.
