Helping your Child Learn

Parents and carers play a critical role in developing skills in our children. There are lots of easy ways to help kids learn while at home or while out shopping.

- Have kids collect the number of items you need, for example, 6 oranges, 2 loaves of bread, find the 2L milk container.
- Get kids to help read through a recipe and help to measure things out when cooking.
- If you get pizza for dinner, ask kids to show you half or quarter of it. Fractions are an incredibly important part of their learning in numeracy.
- Read a book together reading to your child is an important part of learning about vocabulary and gives kids ideas about writing.






Welcome to 3-4E


actions.

News from the Library



All students at Ballina Public School are encouraged to participate in the Premier's Reading Challenge 2021! The Challenge aims to instil and promote a love of reading for pleasure and to enable them to experience quality literature.

The Challenge begins on 1 March 2021 and continues until the 20 August 2021.

In order to complete the challenge, students must read a certain number of books in the below timeframe. Your child will be supported during library time to learn more about this challenge and to select PRC books that are appropriate for their age, interest and maturity levels. Challenge	Number of books you must read	Minimum number of PRC books	Maximum number of personal choice books	PRC booklists you can read from
K-2	30	25	5	K-2, 3-4, 5-6
3-4	20	15	5	3-4, 5-6, 7-9
5-6	20	15	5	5-6, 7-9

3 – 6 Students

Students in 3 - 6 are to record books they read independently on an electronic student reading record in the PRC website. Parents can support their child by helping them record their books read at home. Students logon using their *existing DoE User ID and password*. Students can also log their books read during library time each week.

K – 2 Students

Students in K - 2 read their PRC books as a class during library lessons and these will be automatically added to their electronic log.
