Mrs Wheatland said "It was the best day of her career", that was until her chain broke!



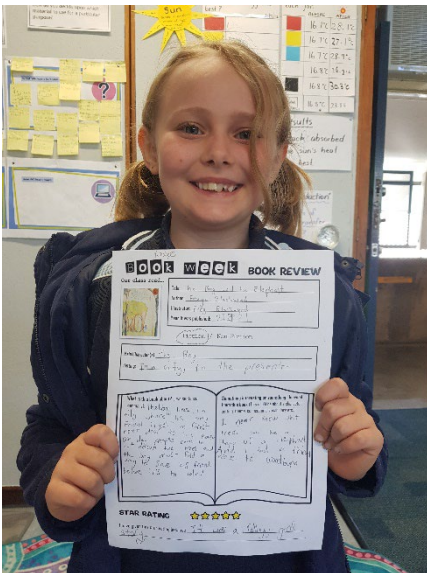
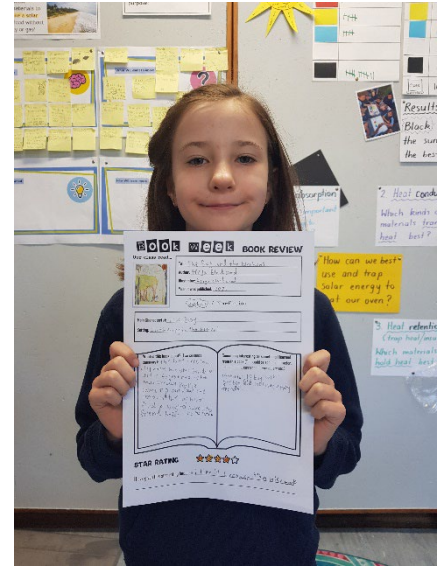
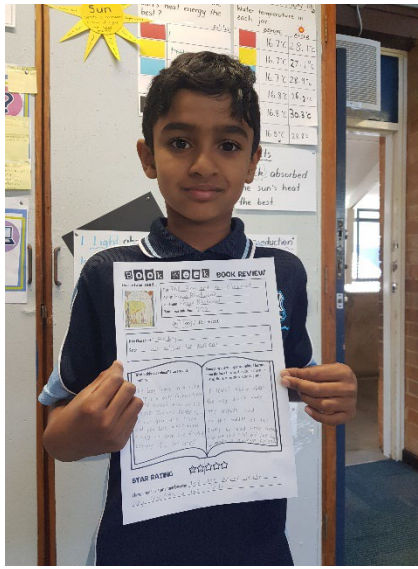
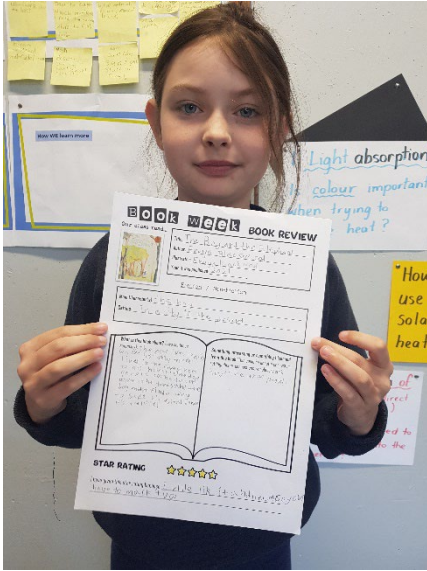
Byron Bay Writer's Festival

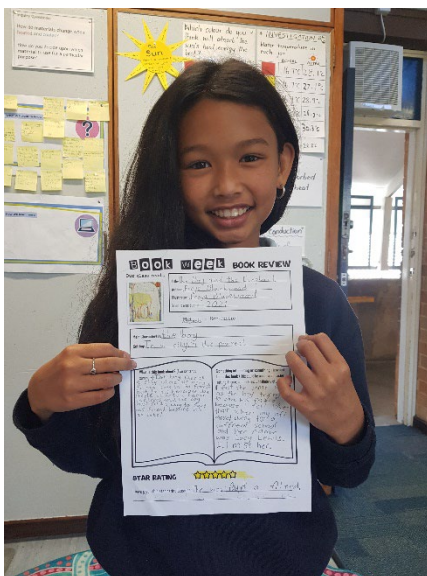
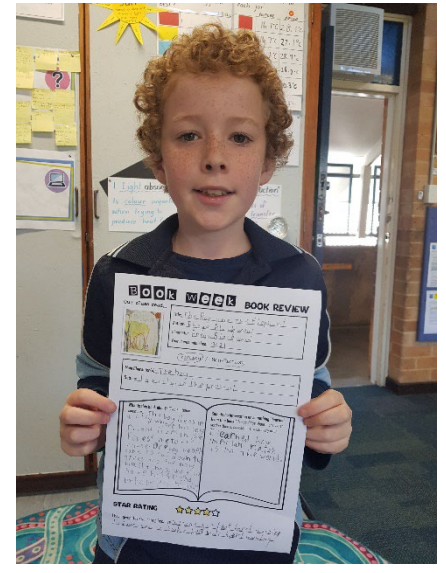
