Check In Assessments

Students in Year 3, 4 and 5 will participate in the Check In Assessments for literacy and numeracy during Week 4. Teachers use this data to inform teaching and learning cycles, and produce report data.

Bus Behaviour

We would like to remind our students that appropriate bus behaviour should be shown on the way to and the way home from school. It is expected that students sit in their seats with their seatbelts on (where provided) during their trip. This will help to reduce students moving around unnecessarily and allow the driver to concentrate on the bus route. Food should not be eaten on the bus, and water should be the only drink. Rubbish should stay in student bags. Students should use appropriate school talk with others. Students are reminded that unsatisfactory behaviour can result in the temporary loss of a bus pass- at the bus company's discretion.

Pick Up and Drop Off Zones

Check In Assessments - Years 3, 4 & 5

Next week, students in Years 3, 4 and 5 will be participating in the Reading and Numeracy Check-in assessments.

This is a NSW Department of Education online literacy and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor student learning. The assessment supplements existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs. Students with a disability may receive the same level of support during the assessment they would normally receive in the classroom.

All year 3, 4 and 5 students will undertake a reading assessment in the morning and a numeracy assessment after lunch.

Class 3-4S

Students in year 3 are engaging in their Science and Technology unit 'Exploring the Earth's Surface' and as a result will be learning:

- Why the Earth's surface changes over time as a result of natural processes and human activity, for example:
 - Characteristics of soils
 - Evidence of natural changes in landforms, rocks or fossils
- That scientific knowledge helps people understand the effect of their actions, for example:
 - How erosion is caused by human activity
 - How erosion can be minimised

The Investigation pictured is the students creating soil solutions which allow the components of the soil to separate in to visible layers and makes them easier to identify and quantify.
