Primary Principal's Association State Conference

Last week I had the pleasure of attending the NSW Primary Principal's Association conference in Sydney, an important opportunity to connect with colleagues and learn from each other. In addition, we heard from several speakers from a variety of backgrounds. These included 2021 Australian of the Year, Grace Tame, and adventurer James Castrission, who walked from the edge of Antarctica to the South Pole — and back! Inspirational stories of resilience and grit came from every speaker, providing all principals with new learning to take into their schools.

We also heard from Mark McCrindle, the founder of McCrindle Research, an Australian social researching company. McCrindle talked about the six 'Generations' - you might recognise yours in the picture. He also taught the principals in the room about "Generation Alpha", the name he has coined for people born between 2010-2024. These are the kids of today – highly relevant information for those of us in primary schools.

I would like to thank Mrs Wheatland for stepping into my seat for the week, and all the assistant principals for supporting her.

Our Years 3, 4 and 5 students have been busy completing Check-In Assessments this week to 'check' their understanding in various areas of Literacy and Numeracy. 




