### NAPLAN – Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> March (Years 3 & 5)

Wednesday the 15<sup>th</sup> to Tuesday the 24<sup>th</sup> of March is the start of The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). This is an annual national assessment for all students in Years 3, 5, 7, and 9, and is the only nationwide assessment that all Australian children undertake. Students will be assessed on reading, writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy.

The purpose of the NAPLAN assessment is to see how each student is developing their literacy and numeracy skills. From this information we are able to differentiate our teaching and learning programs to meet the learning needs of each student.

You can support your child to achieve to the best of their ability by ensuring they have:

- a good night sleep.
- eat a good nutritious breakfast
- arrive at school on time (this is very important as these assessments are strictly timed)

All year 3 students will sit the NAPLAN assessments in the hall during the morning session.

All year 5 students will sit the NAPLAN assessments in the hall during the middle session.

## Excursion to Southern Cross University Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> March, 2023

Last Friday Stage 2 enjoyed an excursion to Southern Cross University where we were treated to a day of interacting with real scientists! We dip netted in a pond with Brendan to find small animals that make up an ecosystem and played Water Bug Bingo.

We spent time in the Science Labs with Tony where we viewed the amazing collection of preserved animals and used our knowledge of branching keys to classify animals. Liam introduced us to his love of frogs, and how he studies when and where frogs are found in Australia. He encouraged us to get the FrogID app on our phones so we can become frog scientists too. Prof. Renaud showed us his collection of skulls to inform us of the way that different species evolve and adapt to their environments. Maria took us koala spotting and showed us how to identify a healthy koala by looking at its pooh! Pre-service teachers assisted us in our groups enthusiastically and we really enjoyed spending time at the university, with many children now understanding that your passion can become a job!

In the classroom they are busy improving their knowledge of graphemes (letters that join together to make sounds in words) to make them better readers and spellers.

Year Two have been completing literary studies around the books "Our Island" and "Under the Southern Cross" which involves mapping out different places around Australia and what connections we have to these places. We are immersed in rich vocabulary and learning many new words.

In numeracy we are learning how to identify, classify and create patterns with both numbers and shapes. In science we are learning about how living things change and reproduce. We are observing the patterns of growth and change in living things, describing patterns, and making predictions.
