



Principal's Message

NAPLAN

Testing for NAPLAN started this week. Mrs Whalan has done a wonderful job of organising this, with arranging times, staff, and the technology team to support the process. Our Year 3 and 5 students will be sitting their NAPLAN assessments over the next week and a half. Like 2022, the assessments will be online except for Year 3 Writing which is still a paper assessment. The NAPLAN Online assessment window starts on Wednesday 15 March 2023 and finishes on Monday 27 March 2023. Students will be assessed in Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language and Numeracy. The online format is an adaptive program, designed to assess a wider range of student abilities and to measure student achievement more precisely. If you have any concerns regarding NAPLAN, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

Attendance

Research highlights a clear correlation between student attendance and the achievement of quality academic, socio-economic and health outcomes. This research tells us that students with an attendance rate below 90% are educationally at risk.

We are aiming for Ballina Public School students to come to school at least 95% of the time - this will assist them in getting the best outcomes for their future.

Arriving at school on time (before 9:15am) and staying all day (until 3:15pm) is an important aspect of this – please allow your child/ren to be in attendance for the whole day. Please take the time to read the Attendance notice included in this newsletter.

Respectful communication is a right

In all workplaces people have the right to feel respected. Unacceptable and offensive behaviour has no place in our school communities.

- derogatory comments or using a rude tone.
- Treating members of the school community differently due to aspects such as their religion or disability.

School Works Notification

NSW Department of Education – School Infrastructure

Ballina Public School Works notification | 15 March 2023

Dear staff and parents/carers,

Upcoming maintenance work to remove asbestos containing material and lead based paint at Ballina Public School will take place outside of school hours between Friday 17 March and Sunday 19 March 2023.

The work locations include:

- inside the walls of one classroom in Building A and one classroom in Building D
- lead based paint from a classroom in Building D
- in the ceiling lining of an undercover area in Building I

The work will also involve removing vinyl tiles discovered under the carpet in a classroom in Building A and D.

The areas have been cordoned off and are currently out of bounds to students, staff, and school visitors.

The areas will remain out of bounds until the removal works are finished and have been inspected by an independent hygienist to confirm they have been fully remediated. The school will receive a clearance certificate from the hygienist before these areas are reopened to students and staff.

Work will be done in accordance with SafeWork NSW regulations and the NSW Department of Education's Asbestos Management Plan. All work will be completed by licensed and accredited asbestos contractors and monitored by occupational hygienists in strict accordance with all applicable legislation, regulations, policies, and guidelines.

The health, safety, and wellbeing of the school and the local community is our highest priority. Thank you for your cooperation during this important work.

As part of professional learning for teaching staff, the clinicians will be spending time with the teachers to gain an understanding of how the classroom runs, any concerns the Teachers may have about how their classrooms are functioning, and provide advice to teachers on supporting learners' regulation, learning and attention in the classroom. 
Wear Orange to School
