Building Resilience

Resilient kids know how to cope and have the skills that can help them handle problems and different situations. Sometimes things don't go the way we had planned, and being resilient means we can carry on with our day without it being a huge problem. At BPS we are working to help our students become more resilient. We would like to work with our families to increase resilience in all of our students. Here are some ways you could help at home.

- Encourage your child to talk about things that are bothering them. Learning to seek help when a problem can't be solved is an important lifelong skill. Let your child know that unhappy or difficult times are a normal part of life and don't usually last for too long.
- Encourage your child to re-phrase their unhelpful thinking.
 Teach your child to turn words such as "I'm stupid" or
 "They hate me" into more helpful and optimistic thinking —
 "I made a mistake, everyone makes mistakes" or "They
 don't hate me, they just feel like playing with someone else
 today."

We have an important role to play as adults. At home, try to model these skills to your child. Talk your problems through with others and review different solutions.

- Use optimistic thinking and say things such as 'Things will get better soon.'
- Talk about how you may have managed strong emotions in a calm way.
- Talk about your goals and how you hope to achieve them.
- Show appreciation to others for their friendship.



Children are always watching and will copy what we do. Be a positive role model. Use these skills and show your child how to be resilient.

NAPLAN

Monday the 13th of March is the start of The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) and concludes on Monday the 25th of March.

This is an annual national assessment for all students in Years 3, 5, 7, and 9. Students will be assessed on reading, writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy.

The purpose of the NAPLAN assessment is to see how each student is developing their literacy and numeracy skills. From this information we can differentiate our teaching and learning programs to meet the learning needs of each student. You can support your child to achieve to the best of their ability by ensuring they:

- Have a good night sleep.
- Eat breakfast.
- Arrive at school on time (this is very important as these assessments are strictly timed and some assessments will start soon after the morning bell).





Class KF – Mrs Franklin














Clean Up Australia Day – Friday 1st March
